What is it? : A Pioneerscape displays a collection of visual, symbolic representations of significant individuals. The strategy is derived from the Peoplescape created on the ground of Parliament House for Australia's Centenary of Federation 2001. To create a Pioneerscape students/schools research an individual then draw, paint and/or attach collage materials and texts to a plywood board cut-out figure. A Pioneerscape figure is a self-standing structure. The artwork on the Pioneerscape should incorporate symbolic representations of the history, culture and social contribution of the significant person.

Schools choose a local pioneer from a list provided by the Wollondilly Heritage Centre and Museum on their website. Or contact the museum. www.wollondillymuseum.org.au	By 22 nd July, 2016	Send your registration to tohs1988@bigpond.net.au The cost of the first figure is free to Wollondilly Schools.
Schools may choose to do a second figure by choosing a pioneer significant to their school's history but who may not be on the official list. Eg., a principal, teacher or student that has been a significant member of the school community.	By 22 nd July, 2016	When you register your participation, nominate your second person (there will be a cost of \$15 to receive a second figure shape)
Figures delivered to schools (each is approximately 1.2m tall)	From 25 July, 2016	The Oaks Historical Society volunteers will deliver figures to schools.
School research and prepare figures- could be a class group exercise or invited students.	25 July - 25 August, 2016	Using a durable medium that will withstand display outside. The museum will add a final weatherproof sealer to all figures.
Figures completed and taken to WHC (or arrange pick up). 43 Edward Street, The Oaks	Between 10-12 on Thurs, 25 Aug. or Sat. 27 th Sept. or Sun. 28 th Aug.	Notify the museum of your preferred delivery by Monday, 22 nd August.
Schools provide up to a two page history of their pioneer to be added to a catalogue for the opening.	By Thursday, 25 th August .	Email: tohs1988@bigpond.net.au
Figures to be arranged on slope between Drill Hall and Faces and Places building for an Open Day on Saturday, 2 nd September.	During week 30 August - 1 September	The Oaks Historical Society Inc. Volunteers.
